


## The Poirier's Annual Mission Update

Dear friends in Christ:

The year 2016 is now complete and while it will long be remembered as a year of embittered politics and terrorism attacks here and abroad; for Naida and I, it was much quieter.

We started the year with high expectations of her mother coming to live with us and getting the church building and community outreach projects under way here in Jackson. God though in His infinite sovereignty it seems had other plans for us.

First as I noted last spring we moved into a rather large home with the anticipation of Naida's mom relocating from Puerto Rico to live with us due to health reasons. She did in fact come and stay with us for 8 weeks but missed her home and friends in PR too much. That combined with the huge increase in health care cost she would have paid here, (go Obamacare) she decided to move back home. Now Naida and I have a very large home for just the two of us, plenty of room for visitors hint. Naida's mom is managing back in PR with the help of her church family and a very thoughtful neighbor.

The church project was slowed while the members voted on a number of issues, including finances. They are moving forward, have secured the services of a local architect/engineer and could possibly break ground later this year, next at the latest.

The community outreach project did not materialize so Naida has, on her own, gone out and got a part time job at a community thrift store. She is doing many things similar to those she did with MS. Bea at the Mercy House distribution center in Lakeshore and is enjoying it very much.

They love her there especially her work ethic so much so they want her full time but because of her disabilities we have to limit her hours.

I have been staying busy this past year with college, projects around the house, the church (mowing and other small things) and odd jobs in the neighborhood. It seems the two previous owners of our house were the developments handyman and that distinction has past to me. In addition our realtor has gotten me some work on the side doing repairs to homes for sale.

There have been some highlights this past year; first the Briarwood Terrace Community Picnics held in April and Oct. These are bring a dish to share at a 3 hour neighborhood get-together of the folks in our development. The October one was held at our house and some 62 families came, heard a blessing of the meal and we also got to share a lot about church building, Christ and much more. I have been asked/tasked with building a sign for the entrance to the subdivision and three "little lending libraries" for the neighborhood.
