The left's war on Christians continues

A Utah school has banned the King James Bible from school libraries claiming it includes sex and violence. If sex and violence is the standard, then every history book should be banned. Are books about LGBTQ+ allowed?

Maryland teachers required students to read LGBTQ books which were counter to their religion.

The Los Angeles Dodgers honored a drag queen group who were mocking some of the most sacred aspects of Christianity. How much more offensive will these leftist Christian-haters become?
